- Your academic pursuits, major, your career goals, plans for the future
- Awards/honors you have achieved
- Clubs and other extra-curricular activities in which you participate
- Volunteer activities/community service interests
- How the scholarship will assist you in pursuing your studies at Northeastern
- Co-ops, internships, or study abroad experiences

The letter may be typed or hand-written. Please read over the following guidelines when writing your letter, as it is important that they are followed. Otherwise we may not be able to give the letter to the donor:

- Address your letter to "The Trustees of" your specific scholarship
- <u>Proofread</u>—donors like to see that their money is going to support someone making the most of their education.
- Make sure to sign your letter.
- When you are finished writing your letter, please fold it and put it in an envelope to protect it.
